While Bible Studies have been going on for many years at the Kitsap County Jail there was little or no knowledge of Christian based jail aftercare options. It has been my privilege to provide aftercare options to inmates as well as educate our volunteers on Christian Faith-Based Recovery and Discipleship programs. God has blessed the effort. One of the biggest blessings has been the connection made with **Set Free Ministries** Pastor and Director Mike Tallman. While the Set Free home is located in Elma, God has given Mike a vision for possibly starting a Set Free home here in Kitsap County. He travels from Elma one day a week to assist me in ministering to the inmates here in Kitsap County. What a blessing that has been. Please pray that one day a Set Free Ministry house will be established here. Additionally, we have been blessed to make connections with **Gethsemane Ministries**. They have a wonderful property off the Hood Canal outside of **Union** and have a house in Shelton (which is just 6 miles away). Also just last week I had the privilege of taking a man released from King County Jail to a Christian Faith-Based Discipleship Training House in Burien which is part of the Praisealujah Discipleship Ministries. Please pray that God would bless and use these ministries for His good pleasure and eternal glory.
